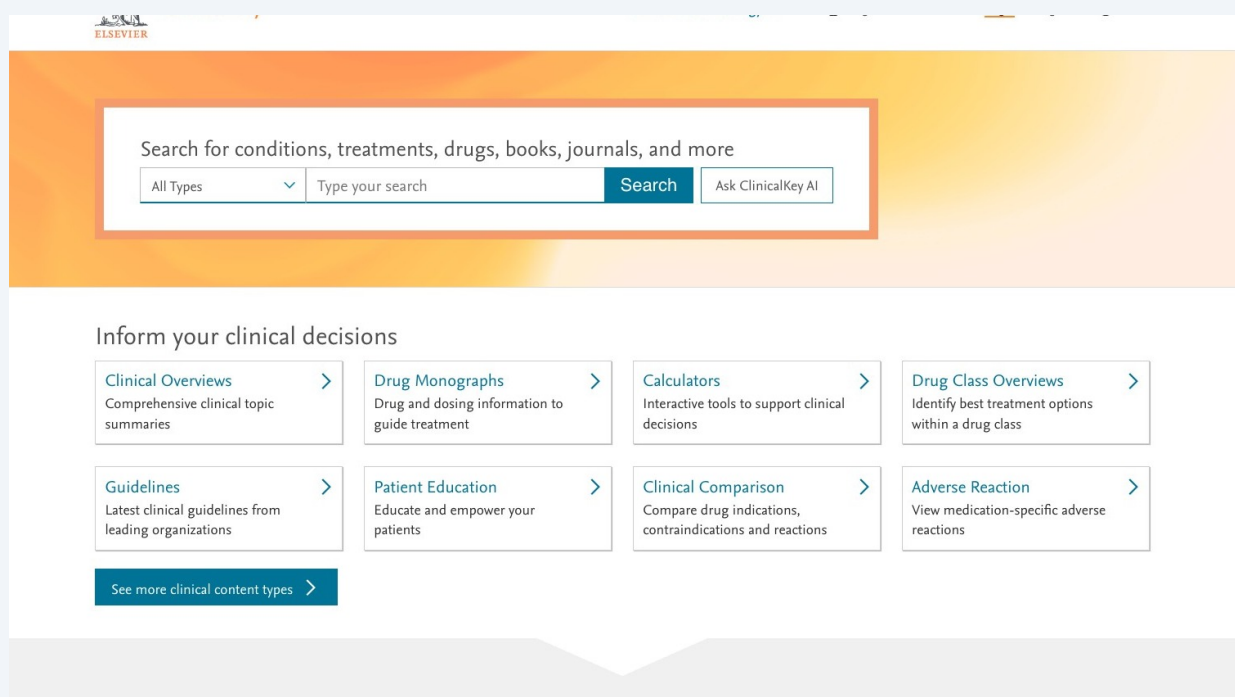


# Log into the ClinicalKey Bookshelf Mobile from CK

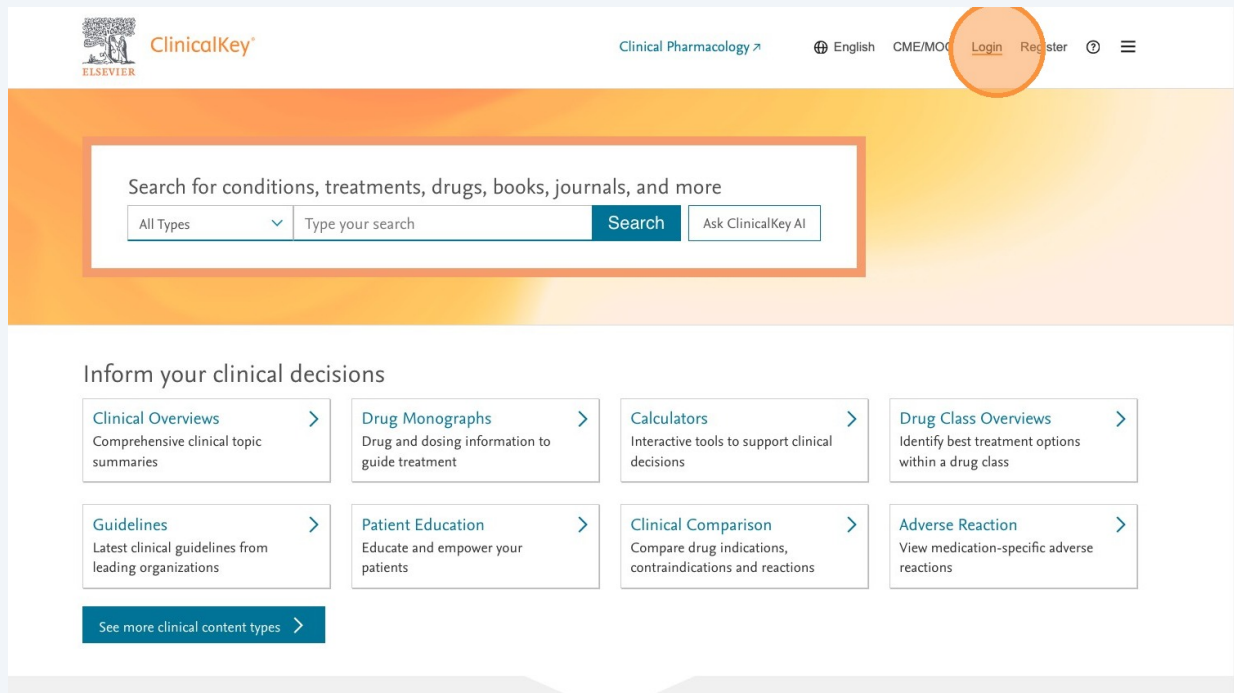

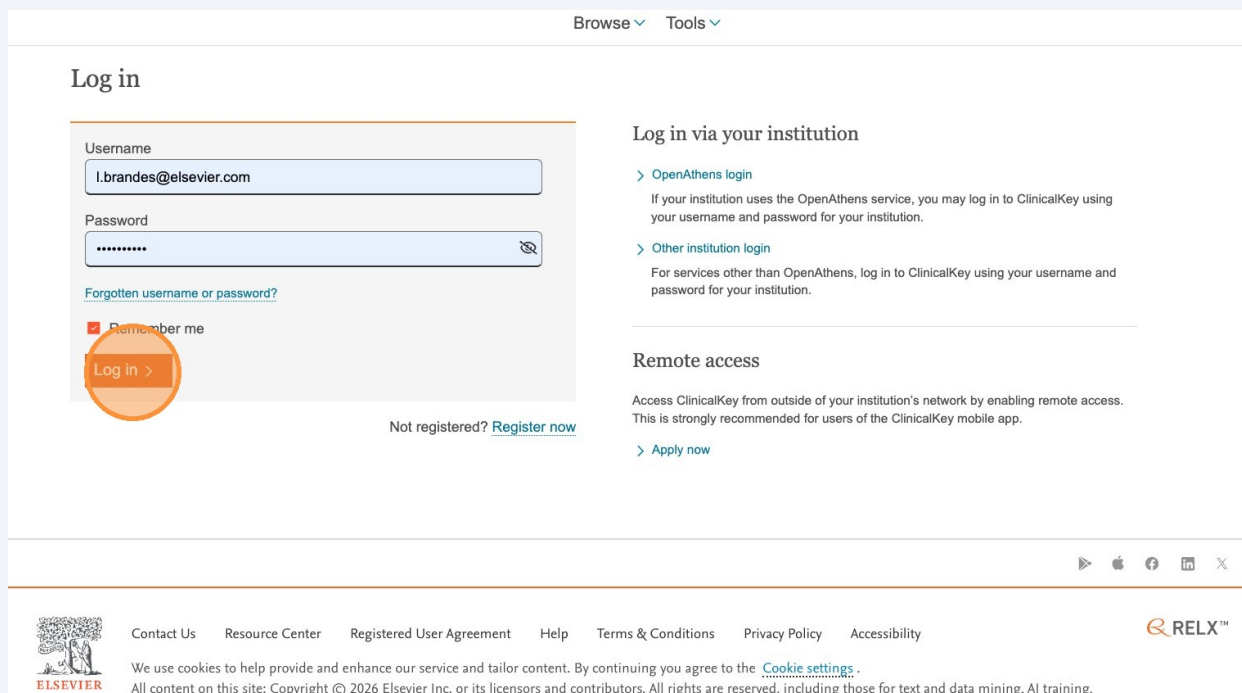


## 2 Click "Login" to sign into your account

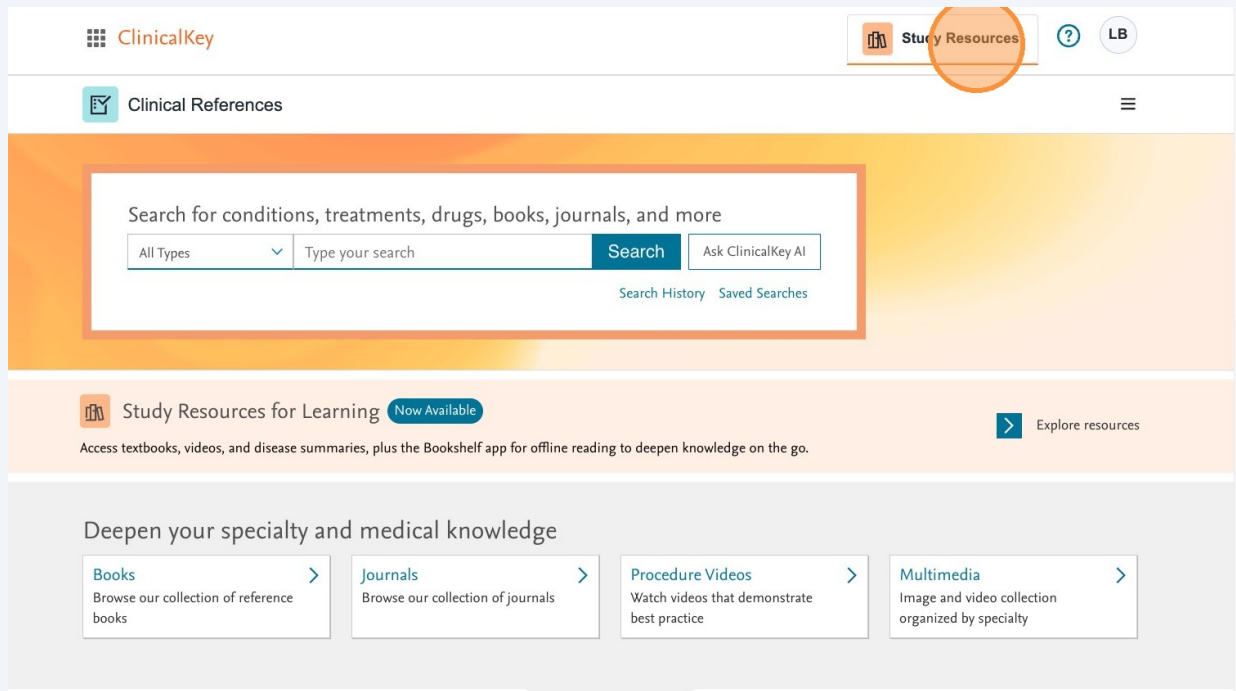

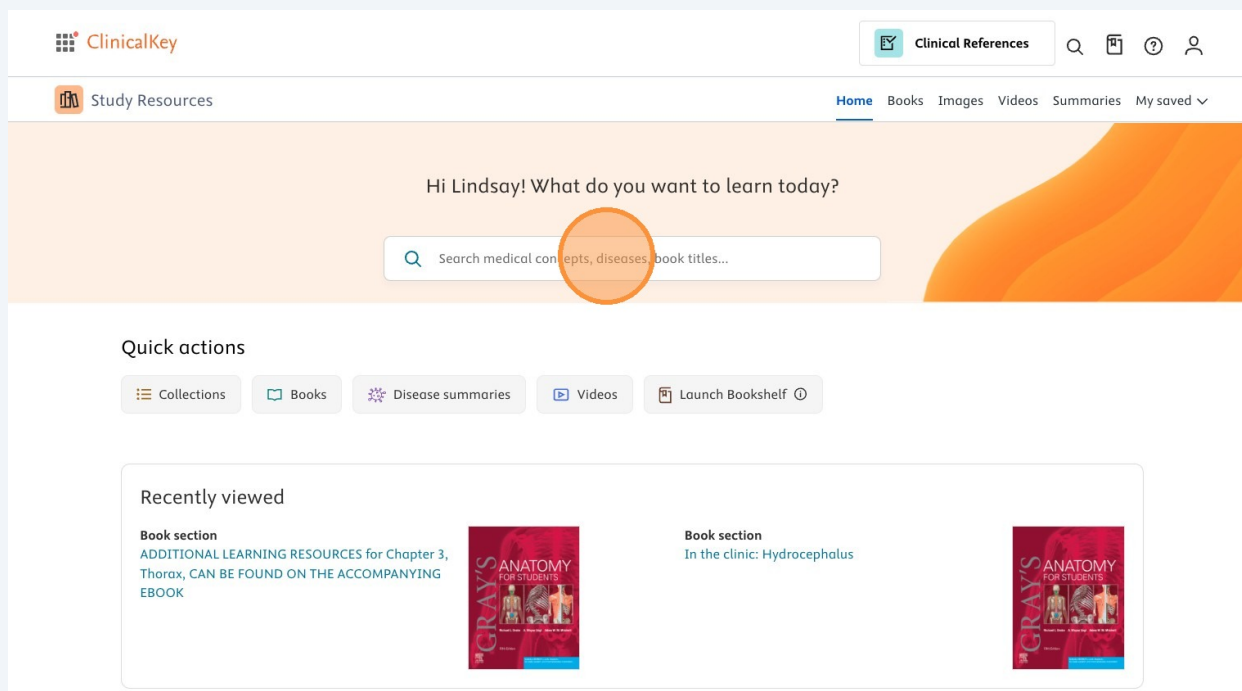

Click the "Search" and type the name of a book.

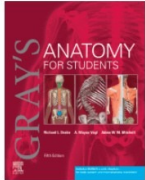


## 6 Once you open the book, choose "Add to Bookshelf" and then "View in Bookshelf"

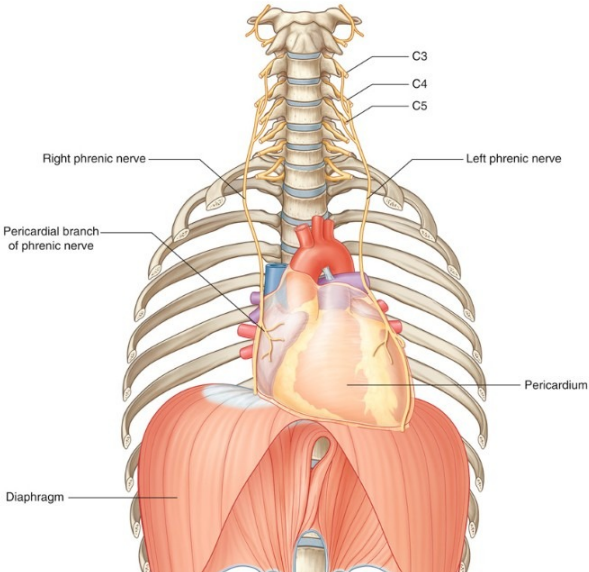

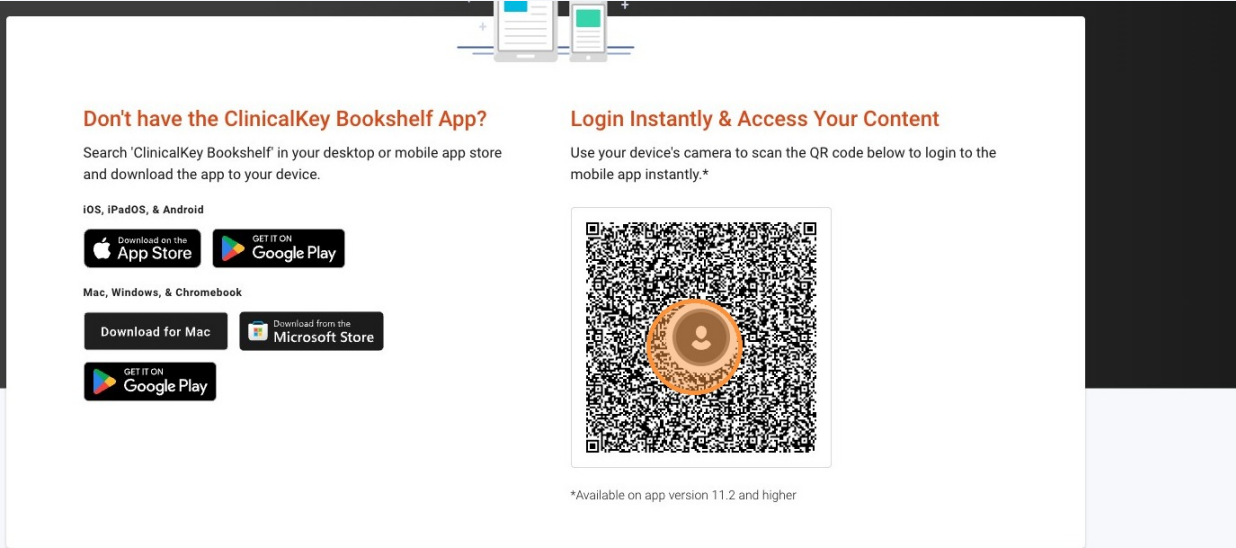
